Oroville School District is an RTI district that embodies the PLC process that uses data and action learning to drive district, building and classroom level decisions to support students and their needs, clinically, within a tiered instructional framework; Data analysis occurs annually as a district with staff, and then, at a minimun, every six weeks at the building level, as well as weekly and every three weeks at the classroom level.
